

Michael Georgetti is a Melbourne-based artist and completed his Masters of Fine Art at RMIT University in 2007. Through painting, sculpture, installation and film, Georgetti explores the duality of behaviour and technology; the way thoughts and feelings manifest within the mechanical and constructed environments.

It often appears as though inanimate objects can attain a personality, a consciousness and can behave in a playful and creative manner when arranged in a certain way. These objects can be used as instruments to make an image. This exhibition focuses on the slippage that occurs between an idea and an expression, and how the personality of a moving object can expand on this duality in relation to human behaviour.
